We are so grateful for all of you!



Pest Control - Please do not treat your own pest problems. Let our office know as soon as you have a problem with pests. We can arrange a visit by our Pest Control company who will take all safety precautions when entering and treating your suite.

Garbage and recycling - DO NOT take items left out in recycling. The items may have pests that you do not want to bring back to your suite.

Christmas Gifts - A group of volunteers, organized by the church, will be preparing a Christmas gift for every resident that will be delivered to your door next week. (unless you have opted out). We are grateful for the work of these volunteers!

Use of Laundry Rooms - The laundry rooms are places where we end up interacting, even briefly, as we all need clean clothes! Please monitor the security channel and use the laundry rooms during quieter times. Never use the laundry room if you are ill and always keep your mask on while in the laundry room. Keep your visit short and fold clean clothes back in your suite. Avoid removing other people's clothing from washers or dryers and instead use other available washers or dryers. If you have someone who does your laundry, please ask them to follow these guidelines.
